Indy film shot here

"Somebody," a movie written and directed by Stamford resident Paul David Anthony, will be premiering at the New Canaan Library Saturday, May 6, at 4. The film was shot almost entirely in lower Fairfield County, primarily in Stamford, Greenwich and Darien.

Complimenting the location are the actors who are also area residents. The director, along with production assistant Will Mathews, completely produced and funded the film without any external financial support. The "no budget" film was shot on black and white 16mm film. It is an unofficial sequel to an earlier movie called "Bitterness" in what is to be a three-part trilogy.

The movie runs approximately 38 minutes and it is about a woman who is overcome with feelings of insignificance. The story follows Candy (played by Kim A. Scofield of Stamford) who finds herself overwhelmed with a small fish in a big pond complex who thinks she can cope by moving from a big city out to the suburbs. She tries to escape through drinking and taking pills. She begins a downward spiral while displaying fits of anger in an attempt to stay in control. The cast also includes Doug Edwards (Norwalk), Carl Smith (Greenwich), Charlie Hewson (formerly of Darien), Renee Fortin (Wilton) and Lisa Fitzsimmons (Stamford).

The movie is artistic and edgy in nature and depicts scenes that show and/or suggest some violent imagery, according to a press release. The dialogue is campy and the acting is extemporaneous. Because of these two factors, the film leans toward the black humor genre. Although it is not rated, the subject matter and language are not suitable for children.
